ALWAYS CONSIDER:

- Is my site safe?
 - Have I walked the site?
 - Is it guarded properly?
 - Is my site tidy?
 - Is it signed and lighted properly?
 - Are there any trip hazards?
- Am I minimising disruption?
 - Think about site design and layout
 - How are my vehicles and materials stored?
 - Are diversions signs in place?
 - Can I display a sign with the works completion date or reasons for non-occupancy?
 - Is it appropriate and safe to use plating?
 - Can I do first time reinstatement?
 - Can I use minimum dig technology?
- Am I operating in accordance with regulations?
 - Have I applied for my notice / permit within the necessary timescales?
 - Am I meeting the requirements of my permit?
 - Am I doing everything I can to finish on schedule? If likely to overrun, have I notified the relevant highway authority with a robust justification?
